

VILLAGE COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS

February 3, 2025

The Lincoln Village Council met on Monday February 3, 2025 at 7 p.m. at the Village Hall. The meeting opened with the Pledge of Allegiance. Those present included President Phillips, Treasurer Mahalak, Clerk Somers and Zoning Administrator/Council Member Durham, Lucas, Potts, Schick, Deputy Treasurer/Council Member Skuse and Wambold. The minutes of the January meeting were approved on a motion from Durham with support from Wambold. The Treasurer's report was approved subject to audit on a motion from Schick with support from Wambold. The bills were approved for payment on a motion from Wambold with support from Skuse. President Phillips gave paperwork that deals with the traffic control orders for the village that was given to us by Road Commission managing director, Jesse Campbell. She asked if Council Members want to do a study of the entire length of F-41 that goes through the village. A motion was made by Wambold with support from Potts to do a traffic study on all the roads in the Village. Carried. Shawn and Cindy McCuiston visited with council members. They are the new owners of Lincoln Laundry. Committee reports were given. A motion was made by Wambold with support from Skuse to publish a survey that has been put together by NEMCOG as part of an updated Master/Parks and Recreation Plan. Carried. The survey will be available online at our website Villageoflincoln.com. Copies will be available at the Lincoln Branch of the Alcona County Library or also at the Lincoln Laundry. Copies may also be picked up by contacting Dorene Schick RRC Administrator at 989-335-5075. Durham gave the Zoning report. He has sent letters to places in the village that need attention. Gary Graves gave the maintenance report. He has been keeping busy plowing snow. Nathan Walker gave the fire department report. He showed the new nozzle that they have obtained for the fire department. One member of the FD Fire Department has been notified that he passed the test for EMT. Two of the newer members have recently finished CPR classes and two are going through the fire academy. There is supposed to be an EMT class being offered soon for interested members. He is currently working on Standard Operating Procedures. He stated that he got a DNR grant for a dry hydrant. President Phillips gave a copy of the new fire budget for the upcoming year. A budget workshop will be held on Thursday evening. A motion to adjourn was made by Schick with support from Durham. Carried.
